

**GOLF TOURNAMENT  
SEPTEMBER 26**

**LOCAL TEAMS RAISE \$975**

**STREETS AND TREES**

Legends residents have complained about the lack of “street” trees throughout the neighborhood. Ed Colaprete and Don Loesch met both with Mayor Ken Branner and Frog Hollow LLC to discuss the issue. Frog Hollow is responsible for the east side, Simpson Place, McCumber Lane, Watson Lane, Snead Circle, Couples Court and half of Porky Oliver. Most of the east side has been planted. They know where trees were planted and where they were not. Their plan is to complete the job in Spring 2005 after the roads on the west side have been paved. Frog Hollow will be notifying affected home owners and requiring that they sign off on accepting the trees.

The remainder of the west side is the responsibility of the individual builders/developers. Our information is that the planting will be handled by Kershaw Construction, also in Spring 2005.

Work is underway to bring curbing, manhole covers, etc up to Middletown specifications for the final paving of the streets on the west side. Apparently Middletown will not grant approval until all of the building is complete. One of the questions that Mayor Branner will address at the Membership Meeting is whether the currently finished streets can be done.

**ARC UPDATE**

The Architectural Review Committee (ARC) will hold a meeting at the conclusion of the Civic Association meeting. An election will be held to fill two positions on the ARC. Vicki Loesch’s term is expiring and Allison Gill has resigned. Anyone interested in serving on the ARC should contact Vicki at 376-7955 or Ivan Jackson at 376-4355. In addition there will be discussion on modifying the Deed Restrictions and Architectural Standards to change the type of fences that can be erected.
