Typically the town would not allow the paving until the building was complete. Frog Hollow did not want to participate in that plan, preferring to wait until late spring. So, should we get snow, Middletown will plow the paved areas, Frog Hollow will be responsible for West Whittington Way, and Double-S will be responsible for the remaining unfinished streets.
